Financial Aid Tip for Students, June 2022

Private student loans may fill the financial aid gap

FRANKFORT, Ky. (June 1, 2022) — Many students attending colleges and technical schools will qualify for financial aid to help pay for their education. However, some students may find that federal and state grants, scholarships and federal loans don't cover all their educational costs, according to the Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority (KHEAA).

Students who go to school less than half time generally don't qualify for state or federal financial aid programs.

Private education loans can help students whose financial aid doesn't cover all their costs or students who don't qualify for financial aid.

Because interest rates on private loans depend on the borrower's credit rating, students may have to pay higher rates than they would on federal student loans. In addition, many lenders require students to have a cosigner, and most require the college to certify that the student needs the loan.

Students and parents should compare the private loans offered by various lenders to find the best possible deal. They should also check into the Advantage Education Loan, Kentucky's only nonprofit private student loan. The Advantage Education Loan is offered by KHEAA's sister agency, the Kentucky Higher Education Student Loan Corporation (KHESLC).
